Research has shown that when blueberry plants are not pruned or are pruned too lightly, they become less productive. Join Clallam County Master Gardeners Jeanette Stehr-Green and Audreen Williams to get the facts and learn about pruning blueberry bushes.

Jeanette will describe the typical

growth pattern of a blueberry bush and outline a systematic approach to pruning as well as factors that affect blueberry pruning practices. Jeanette and Audreen will demonstrate pruning techniques on blueberry bushes at the Lazy J Farm and will answer questions about growing and pruning blueberries.

The pruning demonstrations will take place outside rain or shine; participants should dress appropriately and be prepared to stand for 30 minutes or more.

Join Clallam County Master Gardner Muriel Nesbitt for the Green Thumb Education Series presentation "Choosing Your Seeds," Thursday, February 13th from 1:00 – 2:00 p.m. at St. Andrews Episcopal Church, 510 E. Park Avenue in Port Angeles.

Where should you start, what company should you buy from, and which variety should you choose? Muriel will help take the guess work out of your seed purchases by going over which are the best for your needs.

She will delve into topics like which varieties are disease resistant; seeds that thrive where you plant them; what to give seeds so they flourish; and when to plant your seeds. Muriel will also talk about coated, treated or pelleted seeds, heirloom seeds, OP and F1 seeds. She will also cover how to prepare for planting, the new USDA, AHS and Sunset zones and how climate change may affect first and last frost dates.
